Quilting around the Great Lakes Seaway Trail
7 day/6 nights About 520 miles
September 28 - October 4, 2012 to coincide with the "Quilting Around Chautauqua Show."
You can also experience this trip anytime minus the Quilting around Chautauqua Show (1-30 person trip or even bring your husband)



The Great Lakes Seaway Trail is one of America's Byways and is recognized for its unique landscape, scenic freshwater coastline, and historical significance. This National Scenic Byway parallels 518 miles of shoreline along the St. Lawrence River, Lake Ontario, Niagara River, and Lake Erie in New York and Pennsylvania. www.seawaytrail.com

Start in Erie PA
Fri, Sept 28 Go short distance west to International Fabric Collection, Fairview, PA to see International & American Quilt fabrics: Liberty Art Fabric, Japanese, Kona, Guatemala, Australia and French (Buy some local wine)
Overnight at Athenaeum Hotel, Chautauqua Institution.

Sat, Sept 29 Quilting Around Chautauqua Quilt Show at Chautauqua Institution. Hear featured quilt designer, author Jinny Beyer, see quilt exhibit and shop quilt vendors (take a walk and see the Victorian charm of Chautauqua)
Overnight at the Athenaeum Hotel, Chautauqua Institution.

Sun, Sept 30 Follow the Great Lakes Seaway Trail northeast and stop at The Roycroft Inn, East Aurora for a lovely lunch, on to the Amherst Museum, Amherst — then just in case you have never done this, go to Niagara Falls for a ride on the Maid of the Mist (take time for a walk around Goat Island in Niagara Falls.) Overnight at The Barton Hill Hotel & Spa, Lewiston.

Mon, Oct 1 Sleep in, take a stroll & shop in Lewiston, then Follow the Great Lakes Seaway Trail east (stop and see Old Fort Niagara — oldest building on the Great Lakes) along beautiful Lake Ontario to Rochester — on your way stop at Brown's Berry Patch, Waterport for a homemade ice cream cone — then on to the Alling Coverlet Museum in Palmyra. Overnight at Palmyra Inn, Palmyra.

Tues, Oct 2 Take a loop south to Route 20 to Patchwork Plus Quilt Shop, Marcellus to pick up some much needed fabric and yarn too — short drive into North Syracuse to Mission Rose Quiltery for more fabric and yarn and back to Great Lakes Seaway Trail (learn the story of the Safe Haven Museum in Oswego) for dinner in Sackets Harbor at Tin Pan Galley. Overnight at Hotel, Inn or Bed and Breakfast, Sackets Harbor.

Wed, Oct 3 Morning tour at Seaway Trail Discover Center, Sackets Harbor - then on to weaving looms & textile collection at Thousand Islands Handweaving Museum, (maybe ship some River Rat cheese to a friend) Clayton and lunch & shopping on your own — then off to Alexandria Bay for visit to romantic love story at Boldt Castle and 2 hour boat tour of the Thousand Islands. Overnight at Riveredge Resort, Alexandria Bay.

Thurs, Oct 4 Follow Great Lakes Seaway Trail signs north to Dreamcrafters Quilt Shop, Hogsburg — on your way back to start consider Singer Castle on Dark Island.
